How to sort your waste



Pizza trays, napkins, paper towels, wet paper or cardboard. Cigarette butts, nappies, crisps and coffee bags.

All residual waste must be in bags. Remember to tie the knot.



Food scraps and spoiled food. Peels, eggshells and hulls. Fish bones and chicken carcasses. Coffee filters and paper tea bags. Cut flowers.

All food waste must be in bags. Remember to tie the knot.



Wine bottles and other glass bottles without deposit. Glass jars and broken drinking glasses. Vitamin jars and spice jars

Empty and scrape the glass.



Cans, bottle caps and metal lids. Pots, pans and cutlery. Tealight holders. Tin foil, foil trays and cans without deposit.

Empty and scrape packaging.



Clean paper, e.g., magazines, newspapers, weekly periodicals and envelopes both with and without windows. Receipts, paper bags and drawing paper.

Clips and tape may remain in place.



Clean cardboard, e.g., corrugated cardboard and cardboard. Cardboard packaging from e.g., toothpaste and web orders. Pipes from empty kitchen and toilet roll.

Clips and tape may remain in place.



Soft and rigid plastics from e.g., freezer bags, candy bags, bubble wrap, shampoo, meat trays and other foods.

Empty and scrape packaging.



Cartons from milk, yogurt, cream, juice, cocoa, chickpeas, peeled tomatoes, vanilla cream and Mornay sauce.

Empty and fold packaging.



Chemicals, poisons, batteries, light bulbs and small electronics. Remnants from e.g., makeup, perfume and nail polish. Spray bottles from e.g., hairspray, lighters, rubbing alcohol and residues from cleaning agents.

All products with hazard labelling on them.



Worn, punctured, stained or otherwise damaged clothing and textiles e.g., towels and bed linen. It must be dry.

Functional clothing should be handed in for reuse.
